Palliative and Hospice Care

- Simply put palliative care is a holistic approach to providing comfort to patients living with serious illness. Hospice is palliative care for the terminally ill.
- A passage from Sunita Puri's book, "That Good Night" : "Can we strive to minimize the suffering inflicted by disease while also embracing more fully the truth that mortality is not a condition medicine should seek to cure?"
- So if mortality is not something medicine should not seek to cure how do we address it?

End of Life Doula Role

- Advance Care planning discussions
- Companion the dying and their family (presence)
- Provide spiritual, emotional, and logistical support
- In-depth conversations on life meaning, unresolved issues
- Help with legacy projects (how do you want people to remember you?)
- Education on the dying process, referrals/resources
- Advocate for end of life care wishes
- Vigil planning(what do your last moments look like?)
- Support family with grief processing
